- To learn the main terminological and conceptual tools used in the analysis of pre-modern European societies and, specifically, of medieval societies.
- To learn the main terminological and conceptual tools used in the analysis of the culture of premodern societies and, specifically, of medieval societies.
- To learn the main debates, theories and problems raised by the historiography of medieval European societies.
- To learn the specific problems raised by gender historiography about the role of women in medieval societies.
- To learn the specific problems raised by the historiography of ethnic-religious minorities in medieval Christian social formations.
