Evaluation

The activities for evaluation are:

- 1. An individual exam on the theoretical content of the subject: 30%.

Assignments with more than 10 spelling errors or incorrectly presented will be returned to the students for correction. These errors of expression or incorrect presentation will affect their grade.

Assignments carried out in this subject must always include a bibliography and / or webliography in which a minimum of 5 documents must come from books and / or journals.
