Methodology

The subject will combine different methodologies according to the objectives pursued in each stage. The combination of theoretical and practical academic sessions is considered essential. At the same time students will be asked oral presentation of aspects related to the syllabus and subsequent debate in order to get involved in their own learning process.

Student may have individualized tutoring to clarify specific aspects.

Evaluation

A system of continuous evaluation is proposed that values the progressive learning of the students:

- Written test on academic aspects of the subject: 50%
- Practical activities on academic aspects of the subject: 20%
- Oral presentation of an aspect treated in the subject: 20%
- Compulsory attendance to seminars on subjects related to the subject: 10%

The evaluation is ongoing. However, students who combine their studies with a full-time job (registered with Social Security) have the right to request an alternative assessment within 5 days from the beginning of the semester.
