Subject's extra information

The program is specially oriented to review the terminology and basic principles of the Spanish syntactic landscape. Although a unique method is followed in sentence analysis, the agenda is not limited to exposing a single perspective of description and analysis, but tries to offer a vision that takes into account the different types of grammars, starting from a point of consistent view that combines the program and allows the approach to the operation of the language without losing sight of its practical application. Consequently, the course proposes, above all, to exercise the critical capacity of the student around the syntactic functioning of the Spanish language and, likewise, to remove him from the prejudices that sometimes involve him when he is ready to work in this field.
