## Learning objectives

Introduction in the study of twentieth century Spanish literature: after offering a historical-literary and methodological overview, the fundamental academic objective is to provide an introduction of the most relevant periods, currents, works and authors of the last century.

## Subject contents

In-depth study of the works, authors and literary traditions of contemporary Spanish literature, paying preferential attention to those texts of greater historical and cultural significance and that best illuminate our present:

Theme 1.- Sources and tools.

- Theme 2.- The "Silver Age": 1898-1939.
- Theme 3.- Dictatorship and exiles: 1939-1975.
- Theme 4.- Literature in freedom: 1975-2023.

## Methodology

In accordance with objectives, competences and contents, different types of methodologies will be combined based on each session and subject (master classes, seminars or debates, for example). Thus, the combination of theoretical and practical sessions is considered essential. For this reason, the student will have read previously the literary documents planned for each session and will be asked for the oral presentation of aspects related to the content. Likewise, he will develop written papers in order to deepen in the subject and to consolidate his learning process. The student counts on individualized and in group tutorials to clarify theoretical and methodological axes.

Teaching methodologies: Theoretical-practical teaching. Practical activities in small groups. Conferences and colloquiums attendance. Classroom discussions. Problem-based learning. Individual tutorials to facilitate the acquisition of the necessary skills in the subject.

This teaching guide will be expanded with more technical details in a document (entitled "Program") in the "Resources" section of the virtual campus.

## Development plan

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Theme 2.- The "Silver Age": 1898-1939 (4 weeks: from March 7 to April 5, 2024).

Theme 3.- Dictatorship and exiles: 1939-1975 (4 weeks: from April 11 to May 3, 2024).

Theme 4.- Literature in freedom: 1975-2023 (3 weeks: from May 9 to 24, 2024).

This plan can be modified according to student's needs.

## Evaluation

The final grade will be obtained from various types of tests. All are mandatory and deliveries after the indicated dates will not be accepted.

#### BLOCK 1

1.- The first test will consist of an audio-visual recording of a poem by a Spanish woman writer (20th-21st centuries). Submission date: February 23, 2024 {10% of the final grade - 10 h. autonomous work}.

2.- The second test will consist of a critical review of 4 papers from the "IV Congreso Internacional Género y Sexualidad en las Culturas Hispánicas" (UdL, February 28-March 1). Extension: 6-8 pages. Submission date: March 10, 2024 {10% of the final mark - 10 h. autonomous work}.

#### BLOCK 2

3.- The third test will consist of a written analysis -of various literary (topic 2)- that will be carried out during the session on April 5, 2024 {25% of the final mark – 20 h. autonomous work}.

#### BLOCK 3

4.- The fourth test will consist of an examination of the contents and readings of "Theme 3". It will take place during the session on May 3, 2024 {25% of the final grade – 20 h. autonomous work}.

#### BLOCK 4

5.- The fifth test will consist of an oral presentation and a "PowerPoint" for the "Theater Workshop" where a theatrical text written between 1970 and 2020 will be analyzed. Presentations during the last classes of the course. PowerPoint submission: until May 26, 2024 {20% of the final mark – 20 h. autonomous work}.

#### BLOCK 5

6.- The preparation of the readings and the active participation in the activities carried out in the classroom represent 10% of the final grade {10 h. autonomous work}.

Format of the exercises: typeface "Garamond" or "Arial", line spacing "1,5", size "12".

The presence of spelling, punctuation, morphological and / or writing errors will always be taken into account when evaluating the course and may negatively affect the partial and final grade. In courses of a Philology degree it is essential to use the language (oral and written) with correctness and rigor.

Evaluation systems: Written tests in the classroom. Original autonomous works, prepared outside the classroom, individual. Resolution of practical cases in the classroom, individual and / or group. Attendance and participation in teaching sessions: classes and training activities.

Students who only submit a total of activities weighing less than 50% of the evaluation will obtain a grade of NP as a final grade. Students who submit activities with a weight greater than 50% will never be able to obtain an NP.

The date for the evaluable activities will be established at the beginning of the semester. Activities submitted after the deadline will earn a 0/10.

Students who want to ask for alternative assessment must submit an employment contract or justify, in a letter addressed to the Dean, the reasons that make it impossible for him/her to carry out the continuous assessment within five (5) days after the beginning of the semester. The assessment will consist of a written exam of the units/blocks 2 and 3 on the date set by the Facultad de Letras (50% of the final grade). That same day will be sent, through the virtual campus, tests 1 (audiovisual recording, 15%), 2 (critical review, 15%) and 5 (powerpoint, 20%).
