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### Learning objectives

- Submit 2 compositions (an expository and an argumentative composition) followed by error analysis and remedial measures.

- Do 2 oral presentations in class, one of them expository and the other argumentative, followed by error analysis and remedial measures.

- Complete language-related activities to familiarize oneself with pragmatic and discourse concepts and morphosyntactic structures characterising expository and argumentative genres in English.

- Develop lexical knowledge of different environments of communication activities, especially those related with the academic, scientific and professional world.

### Competences

- Understanding, producing and interacting in English orally and in writing (C1)

- Understanding argumentative and expository texts in English, on any format (oral, printed, audiovisual), and identify implicit senses.

- Showing flexibility and effectiveness in oral and written English for academic, professional and social purposes.

- Producing English texts that are clear, well-structured and detailed, on complex topics, showing a correct use of mechanisms of text organization, articulation and cohesion.
