During the course we work to reach the C1.2 level of English (Common European Framework of Languages)

• Additional information on Alternative Assessment:

Learning objectives

- Write 2 compositions, one of argumentative genre (to choose between Write an opinion essay I Write a review) in week 5 (October 20) and the other of the expository genre (to choose between Write a news article and Write a city/country guide) in week 11 (December 1) with subsequent analysis of errors and improvements. The following writing skills will be worked on during the course:
- Avoiding repetition
- Hedging and impersonal language
- · Emphasizing a point
- Correcting and improving sentences

On Week 8 feedback will be supplied for Writing 1, and in week 14, for Writing 2.

- Upload 2 oral presentations, one of them of the plot genre (Making a pitch) in **week 8** (November 9) and the other of the exhibition genre (Making an expository speech) in **week 14** (December 22) with subsequent analysis of errors and improvements. The following oral presentation skills will be worked on during the course:
- Powerful words in English
- Use of convincing language and full-content words
- Techniques used for convincing your audience
- Signposting language

On Week **11** feedback will be supplied for Speaking 1, and in **week 15**, the teacher will upload in sakai the feedback of Speaking 2.

• Perform language activities to familiarize yourself with pragmatic-discursive notions and morphosyntactic structures that are characteristic of the expository and argumentative genres in the English language.

The grammatical topics to be evaluated during the course are as follows:

General English Exam 1

- Inversion Week 1
- Emphasis and cleft sentences Week 3
- Conjunctions and discourse markers, linking words, connectors Week 4

General English Exam 2

- Future tense Week 11
- Prepositions Week 13
- Phrasal verbs Week 14
- Develop lexical knowledge in different areas of communication activity, especially those related to academia, scientific and professional.

For this reason, the student will have to work through self-learning in the book Straight to Advanced. Macmillan. See Bibliography.

Material will also be provided and work will be worked on identifying and correcting more frequent errors in Catalan speakers (cognates and false friends, lexical choice, prepositions, linking words)

Subject contents

Teaching is hybrid: half of each subject is face-to-face and the other half virtual

The work done by the student at the end of the course will be the same as when there is face-to-face teaching, since for many years it counts the work that the student has to do through European credits, since each credit is 25 hours of work for the student. This includes self-employment, class attendance, exams, and other tasks specified in the Development Plan schedule. In this subject of **6 credits**, the number of hours to dedicate is **150** hours, which, divided into 15 weeks of a semester, involves <u>10</u> hours each subject <u>each week</u>

Virtual teaching **does not allow the disconnection of the campus.** Every day it is necessary to review the messages of the different topics that may have been sent. Both the teacher and the student will spend time a day on this task.

The course approach is essentially practical, although it will give some theoretical-practical orientations, especially

in grammar and English use, as well as in specifications on definition and characteristics of type of written and oral text argumentative and expository.

Methodology

Continuous evaluation. For many years in college education, the evaluation has been continuous and will **remain** so this course. This implies that different mechanisms are used to evaluate, and not just one.

Given the current health circumstances, it is taught with the teachers of the course: 50% face-to-face, in the classroom. 50% through the videoconferencing tool of the virtual campus. Therefore, you must necessarily have a camera and microphone on your computer. Specifically, Monday classes (9:30-11:00) will be held virtually, while Tuesday classes (9:30-11:00) will be held in person in classroom 2.13.

The course methodology is based on the following axes:

- Videoclasses (Mondays from 9:30-11:00)
- Practical face-to-face classes (Tuesday, classroom 2.13)
- Self-learning based on grammatical activities, use of English, vocabulary, reading and listening comprehension of the books of basic bibliography
- Debates using the Forum tool during the course to offer constant support during the course in the preparation of the 2 tests
- Discussions of doubts about the activities carried out at home, which will take place in the Videoclasses
