General English III is designed to develop students' ability to learn by doing and, therefore, the course methodology is learner-centred. This implies that students are responsible for their learning, and they are expected to work through the course materials before, during and after lectures, be them onsite or online.

The course is organised around 3 units (see Contents and Development plan) which are connected to the social, business and education areas. The final tasks or products will be carried out through two oral presentations (of social and an education topic respectively).

Information on data protection in the audiovisual register in the subject:
