Subject's extra information

Language as a social phenomenon, interactions between language and society. Study of the linguistic aspects of the communities: social and political aspects of the speakers, relations between languages and linguistic planning.

The purpose of this course is to provide an overview of the relationships between language and social mediation, for all the diversity and variation of linguistic uses. The subject will focus both on the origin of our sociolinguistic categories and on the relevance of the context in current research.

Learning objectives

- O1 Reflect on the relations between language and society, from the point of view of linguistic use and the perception of the speakers.
- O2 Acquire the basic concepts for understanding the relationships between language and society, using the appropriate terminology on linguistic diversity and variation.
- O3 Carry out sociolinguistic analysis and comments with a comparative-historical perspective.
- O4 Analyze the linguistic uses of English, Catalan or Spanish, from the point of view of sociolinguistics.
- O5 Critically analyze the social use and the explicit or implicit sociolinguistic conditions on the use of English, Catalan or Spanish.
