Learning objectives

- To master the phonetic description of spoken texts in general (50%) and their phonological structure (50%)
- To study the standard pronunciation of Catalan in its dialectal varieties, especially the nord-occidental
- To contrast the pronunciation of Catalan with that of other languages in contact
