CONTINUOUS EVALUATION DURING THE COURSE

The methodology for preparing each of the topics will be explained in class.

The compulsory bibliography will be annonced at the beginning of the course.

There will be four written exams during the course.

Since none of the tests reaches 30% of the final grade, there is no recovery exam.

Each has a value of 2.5 points where it is valued:

- 1. ANALYTICAL LITERARY COMPETENCE
- 2. USE OF THEORETICAL OR CRITICAL BIBLIOGRAPHY
- 3. LINGUISTIC CORRECTION AND DOMAIN OF THE ESSAY DISCOURSE

FINAL WORK OF THE COURSE:

Description and structural comparison (plot and archetypes) between these three works. It is necessary to include theoretical reflections taken from at least two structuralist theory books. And three books or articles about the writers. A good critical and theoretical study is required to pass the subject.
