CONTINUOUS EVALUATION SYSTEM

It is considered optimal to be able to follow the system of continuous evaluation of the subject.

Continuous assessment consists of four activities:

Activity	Score	Try it
1	29%	Individual Written Test
2	20%	Attendance and active participation in the classroom
3	26%	Resolution of individual theoretical-practical exercise
4	25%	Oral presentation in small groups

Information:

- 1- Written test: Realization of an individual written test, where will evaluate the learning of the contents and complementary material / bibliography. It will be scored from 0 to 10. It is passed with a minimum of 5 points; averages with the rest of the activities from 3 points.
- 2- Attendance to all the sessions of big group and activities of the average groups of the asignatura. Active participation will also be especially valued. Average with other activities from 3 points.
- 3- Resolution of a practical supposition on the concepts worked in the classroom (I will make a social report). Average with other activities from 3 points.
- 4- Oral presentation in small groups to solve a practical case. Average with other activities from 3 points.

Important

- A) If you do not take one or more of the tests / activities planned, you will get a "0", which will average with the others.
- B) It is necessary to obtain a minimum score of 3 (out of 10) in each one of the tests / activities, so that they can make average with the rest of qualifications.

ALTERNATIVE EVALUATION SYSTEM

Those students who are unable to follow the continuous assessment (and demonstrate this, in accordance with the provisions of the Udl and FEPTS regulations) will be eligible for an alternative assessment. This will consist of two tests, at the end of the semester, of a theoretical and practical nature; written, according to the following distribution:

1 (50%) Written test. Test with conceptual and theoretical-practical questions on the subject. It is passed with a minimum grade of 5 points (out of 10 total points). Proof with right to recovery.

2 (25%) Written test. Solving a practical case

3 (25%) Written test. Solving a practical case
