Evaluation

CONTINUOUS EVALUATION

BLOCK 1-Written test (35%)

Assessment activity: Test-type examination (35%) with the right to recovery. The grade of the retake exam is not limited. In the case of taking the make-up exam, the grade that will be considered for the average of the subject will be that of the make-up exam. To make the overall average of the subject, a minimum of 4 must be taken. Continuing with the new evaluation regulations, if a person does not reach a 4 but his average grade is higher than 5, he will be suspended with a 4,9. The date of the exam will be the one listed in the official calendar of exam dates.

BLOCK2-Group work (25%)
