Refusal of convictions and legal accumulation. The third degree of penitentiary and the fulfillment of the death penalty. Conditional freedom. Settlement of final conviction and licensing.

UNIT 8. - JURISDICTIONAL CONTROL OF THE PENITENTIAL EXECUTION. The prison vigilance judge. Attributions and specific functions. Resources against the decisions of the monitoring judges.

UNIT 9. - EXECUTION OF SAFETY MEASURES. Classes and content of the measures. Privative and non-custodial sentences of freedom. Execution in case of concurrence of penalties and measures: the vicarial system.
