## Learning objectives

### Main objectives

- 1) To Know the factors, concepts, and processes of the origin of local development in mountain territories.
- 2) To study the policies and social agents that contribute to the conditions for the development and success of business projects in the mountains.
- 3) To analyze the dynamizing sectors of the local development and to identify the keys of the economic development of the mountain territories from the natural, environmental and socioeconomic resources present in the zone.

## Competences

We will work from examples based on the natural system, the socioeconomic system and the sociocultural system, integrating the diversity of appreciation:

- Key concepts and historical evolution: criticism of the theories of local development applied to the mountain.
- Policies and social agents: Conditions for the development and success of business projects in the mountains.
- The dynamic sectors of local development and the resolution of economic, environmental and technological conflicts.
