"Literatura y género" offers a critical synthesis of some of the most outstanding representations of the lives of trans people (transvestites and transsexuals) in Barcelona during the period between 1914 and 1978, based on the few available literary testimonies -written in different languages-, which will be interrelated with journalistic, essays or cinematographic documents. Second, this subject will address political and socio-historical issues that influenced the plural self-perception of the subjects presented and the debates on the entity of the notion of sexual gender throughout the twentieth century. The subject is divided into four units, corresponding to a theoretical and methodological introduction and three chronological frameworks (1914-1939, 1940-1969 and 1970-1978), which reflect the diversity of discourses and narratives addressed.

Learning objectives

After passing this subject, the students:

- will know and be able to use the category "gender" in literary, artistic and cinematographic analysis.
- will identify the various historical manifestations that gender stereotypes adopt in cultural productions.
- will know some research methods in the human sciences linked to gender studies.
- will have acquired a critical and analytical look at the literary phenomenon from a gender perspective.

Methodology

Teaching will be developed through four didactic units that will be worked on virtually. Each of these units will present a unique assessment activity that corresponds to 25% of the grade.

Didactic units: The teaching team will guide the students throughout their learning process and will continually

follow their training based on topics developed by the teaching staff or basic texts accessible online, which will focus on the acquisition of the theoretical and methodological foundations. Also through a set of activities designed to promote the development of the skills assigned to the subject. Beyond the didactic units, the virtual campus will have additional resources that allow expanding the basic knowledge of each subject.

Development plan

- 1.- Theoretical and methodological introduction: 4 weeks
- 2.- Public lives, private lives (1914-1939): 4 weeks
- 3.- Metaphors of evil (1939-1969): 4 weeks
- 4.- Auguries of freedom (1970-1978): 4 weeks

Evaluation

Teaching will be developed through four didactic units that will be worked on virtually. Each of these units will present a single evaluation activity corresponding to 25% of the grade.
